What We've Been Up To

Since we sent out the last newsletter in early November, we have had time.

- All students participated in the Stack Up Speed Stacking Event. Again this year, they set a new Guinness World with 555 932 students participating worldwide!
- We had a Remembrance Day service with Mr. Chris Piccott speaking to the students as a retired member of our forces. We greatly appreciated his presence and message. The songs of remembrance that the students offered in response were moving and visually beautiful as they used sign language. Everyone is to be commended for their efforts!
- Mr. Chevarie continues to host many events to keep our students physically active. Most noon hours, he has classes "Running Across Canada" and is keeping track of their mileage. We are working east to west, having left from St. John's Newfoundland. Currently, we are traveled 2 243 km and are just on the other side

of North Bay, Ontario, headed towards Thunder Bay where Terry Fox ended his Marathon of Hope.

- All the students participated in a Sports Day in Canada event. They had sporting events and showed their colours wearing jerseys and other sport memorabilia.
- Approximately 40, 3-5 students are being extremely industrious two noon-hours per week, as they manufacture rubber band bracelets for the school's sponsored Ugandan Child, Nakato Catherine.
- Many grade 4 and 5 students participated in the Basketball Jamboree representing our school well, showing good play and sportsmanship.
- The Parent Committee put together a wonderful float for this year's Westside Santa Claus parade with many of the children on the float. We also had students waving to the assembled crowd from the PALS bus.
- While some were at the parade, our school choir was performing at the Empty Stocking Fund. They also presented a cheque from the proceeds of our Charity Pajama Day.
- The Grade 4s visited the Crane Mountain landfill.
- On a cold, blustery day the 3-5 students cheered on two semi-final university men's teams (BC and Alberta) at UNBSJ.
- The Grade 4s had a wonderful opportunity to learn about financial management, compliments of the PALS program.
- The Grade 5 students traveled to Rockwood Park for a "PALS in the Park" program.
- The EYE-DA testing for 2014 kindergarten students was held.
- The Grade 4-5 students participated in the provincial *Tell Them From Me* survey.
