Prestigious Scholarships and Awards won by our 2019 Graduates:

St. Francis Xavier Schwartz National Scholar totaling \$80 000

These scholarships are awarded to students who have demonstrated academic excellence, leadership qualifies and service to others.



ADVANCED PLACEMENT CAPSTONE PROGRAM

Advanced Placement is designed to provide motivated high school students with university level academic courses. The AP program is recognized more widely in North America than any other advanced program with over 3 000 universities and colleges recognizing AP courses as an admission credential.

AP Capstone[™] is a diploma program based on two yearlong AP courses: AP Seminar and AP Research. These courses are designed to complement other AP courses that the AP Capstone student may take. AP Seminar and AP Research use an interdisciplinary approach to develop the critical thinking, research, collaboration, time management, and presentation skills students need for university-level work.
