### ACCESSABLE BY OUR HOMELESS AND COUCHSURFING POPULATION

Open to youth ages 16 to 24 to come take a shower and do their laundry. There is a computer for resume writing/ job searching, or getting in contact with friends or family. Personal hygiene items are also supplied!

### A COMPLETE CLOTHES CLOSET

Youth are able to grab some-new-to-them clothing from our closet. Open to drop in youth during the evenings as needed.

# CASE MANAGEMENT

### REFERRALS CAN BE MADE BY YOUTH THEMSELVES OR BY OTHER AGENCIES

Case Managers work with youth who are homeless, under-housed, in conflict with the law, experiencing mental health issues and substance use.
