

Facilities Overview

Harbour View High School was built in 1925 of brick and mortar. The school resides in a residential area with an outstanding view on three sides. The character and quality of workmanship still resounds throughout the building. Tiled hallways and many examples of wainscoting and built-in cabinetwork are still very evident.

The school has been modernized several times and has had three additional classrooms built and several shop areas converted to classrooms and a second cafeteria in the past few years. The gym received a 20-foot expansion in 1998-1999 and now has pull-out seating for spectators.

Harbour View Houses a 610-seat auditorium with a Casavantes organ and grand piano. The school also has a lecture theatre, gym, and two cafeterias. The guidance area is separate from the administrative area and a Vice Principal is housed on each floor of the building. Besides the woodworking, electrical and cooking labs, HVHS has five computer labs, a wonderful library with the work of Fred Ross and Miller Brittain on display as well as murals by Fred Willard. This work is symbolic of the outstanding Art department the school still has today.

HVHS enjoys lovely grounds with picnic tables and a wonderful view of both the harbour and St John River. The school participates in all NBIAA sports except wrestling and provides year-long programs in drama, musicals, choirs, school newsletter, year book, and band.
