The Marigold Project has served as a model for similar planting programs nationally and around the world. In 2013 *The Marigolds Project* was recognized in the *Guinness Book of World Records* for the most youth planting flowers at one time. Students at Loch Lomond School will be planting marigolds around our school campus and the Saint John Airport Entrance.
