Good Afternoon:

This is Greg Norton calling from Loch Lomond School, with a few updates regarding upcoming events at Loch Lomond School for Monday, March 22nd – Friday, March 26th.

Please be reminded that student drop-off is not permitted prior to 7:50 a.m. Upon arrival in the designated student "drop & go" zone, drivers are not permitted to idle to keep the flow of drop-off traffic moving and to be courteous of those waiting patiently in line and help prevent congestion on Evergreen Ave. and Loch Lomond Rd. Students being dropped-off are asked to exit the vehicle on the passenger side, closest to the school sidewalk. Thank you in advance for your cooperation in keeping our student drop-off zone moving safely and efficiently!

The return to Yellow phase has now resulted in a lessening of the face mask requirements. In addition, the following requirements are in place:

• Students should have 2 clean masks with them every day

Students in K-5 should wear masks in common areas when they are outside of their class bubbles inside the building (e.g. going to the washroom, visiting the resource teacher, going to the gym, etc.)
Students should also have masks on as they approach and board the school buses.

• While masks are encouraged, younger students (K-5) sitting with a member of the same household, or alone, will not be required to wear masks. Older students (Grades 6-12) will wear masks when getting on and off the bus and if they are sitting with another students who is not from the same household.

Loch Lomond School is committed to the health and safety of our staff and students and will keep our families up to date with any new information we receive. Families can also check the <u>GNB website</u> for the latest COVID-19 information.
