This is Greg Norton calling from Loch Lomond School, with a few announcements regarding upcoming events at your school for the week of May 20th – May 24th.

May 20th is the Victoria Day statutory holiday and there are no classes on this day.

May 21st – 24th all Grade 4 students at Loch Lomond School will be writing The Grade 4 Provincial Assessment, which is a measure of student performance in English reading, French Immersion reading, mathematics and scientific literacy at the provincial level. In the spring of 2016, assessment items were field tested, providing items for piloting the following year. These items were developed and selected by experienced New Brunswick educators. This year, will be the first administration of the Grade 4 Assessment. Each student booklet contains four components: English Reading, Mathematics, Scientific Literacy, and French Reading (for French Immersion students only). The Opening Ceremony, Parade, and National Anthem is at 9:45 a.m. and all events are open to the public.
