By ratifying the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child in 1991, Canada made a commitment to ensure that all children are treated with dignity and respect. This commitment includes the opportunity for children to have a voice, be protected from harm and be provided with their basic needs and every opportunity to reach their full potential. Celebrating National Child Day is about celebrating children as active participants in their own lives and in communities, as active citizens who can and should meaningfully contribute to decision-making.

November 17<sup>th</sup> is "Career Dress-Up/When I Grow Up..." at Loch Lomond School. As part of our career week focus, all students and staff are invited to have fun and "dress-up" for a possible future career!
