This is Greg Norton calling from Loch Lomond School, with a few announcements regarding upcoming events at your school for the week of Oct. 14th – Oct. 18th.

The School "ADL Cheese" fundraiser has started and will run from Sept. 25th – Oct. 16th. This fundraising effort helps support many activities and initiatives at Loch Lomond School. Orders are expected to be at the school on the week of November 18th - 22nd. Prizes will be awarded for top seller(s) in Kindergarten-Grade 2 and Grades 3-5. There will also be a special celebration for the top selling homeroom class.

Registration of students entering Kindergarten in 2020-2021 will take place from Tuesday, Oct. 15th – Friday, Oct. 18th. Children born in 2015 will start school in September 2020. Parents/Guardians can visit the school administrative office for registration information.

Please be reminded that student fees can be paid using *SchoolCashOnline* https://asd-s.schoolcashonline.com/ or by visiting the school office. Student fees are \$30 per student or \$60 for families with two or more children.

- **Monday, Oct. 14th** there are no classes because of the *Thanksgiving Day* holiday. On behalf of the entire Loch Lomond School staff we wish you a wonderful holiday with family and friends!
- Wednesday, Oct. 16th is Fluoride Mouth Rinse Day. This program is for students in Grades 1-5 and is a free and effective way to prevent tooth decay. Parental consent forms are required to participate. A special thanks to our parent volunteers that make this program possible!
- Thursday, Oct. 17th students in Mrs. Bryson's 3/4 Homeroom Class and Mrs. Crealock's 4/5 Homeroom class will be travelling to the *Crane Mountain Landfill*. The Fundy Region Solid Waste Commission in cooperation with our school, believe that our students should understand how their waste is handled, how we can maintain our commitment to the environment, and the importance of waste diversion. Each year approximately 2,500 people visit the Glenn Carpenter Interpretive Centre, located on-site at the landfill and LLS is proud to be a part of this program.
- Friday, Oct. 18th in preparation for the annual Grade 4 PALS Train Ride, students in Mme Little's, Mrs. Bryson's and Mrs. Crealock's homeroom classes will receive a Train Safety Presentation. This safety training presentation is a necessary component, in preparation to board the train on the NBM Railway on Monday, Oct. 21st. Students will be given instruction from the CN Police and Transport Canada representative. The safety presentation provides a Grade 4 curriculum link and prepares students for a safe train ride.
- Friday, Oct. 18th is STUDENT VOTE day! This is a parallel election for students under the voting age, coinciding with official election periods. The purpose is to provide young Canadians with an opportunity to experience the democratic process firsthand and practice the habits of informed and engaged citizenship. Student Vote is an authentic learning program that provides students with the opportunity to experience the voting process firsthand and practice the habits of active and informed citizenship. We hope that a strong STUDENT Vote turnout will inspire members in the wider school community to cast their own ballot.
