On behalf of the entire Loch Lomond School staff I would like to welcome Mrs. Krista Creamer to the position of Grade 3 teacher. Due to increased enrollment at Loch Lomond School a new Grade 3 class was created, and we are very pleased to have Mrs. Creamer join the Loch Lomond School community!

Parents/Guardians of students at Loch Lomond School are reminded to report to the school administrative office upon arrival. We do request that parents/guardians do not travel to classrooms to pick-up children. School administrative staff will have the student paged, and then report to the school office for the parent/guardian to sign the student out.

October 21st – 25th is *Safe Schools Week*. At the beginning of a school year, students are commuting to school by foot, by bicycle, by bus and by family car. It is a strategic time to remind all parties involved that with awareness and education, children can get to school and back home again safely. Other topics covered by *Canada Safety Council* include emergency preparedness and environmental safety concerns.
