Oct. 24<sup>th</sup> Loch Lomond School will be hosting a “Spook-tacular” *Night of Reading* from 6:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. All K-5 students and their parents/guardians are welcome to attend, in full Halloween costume, as we promote family literacy and have fun. Oct. 24<sup>th</sup> all Grade 4 students will receive a Train Safety Presentation. This safety training is a necessary component, in preparation to board the train on the NBM Railway on Friday, Oct. 26<sup>th</sup>. Students will be given instruction from the CN Police and a Transport Canada representative. The safety presentation provides a Grade 4 curriculum link and prepares students for a safe train ride.

Oct. 25<sup>th</sup> is a half day for students. Classes will take place for the morning only and buses will begin picking students up for dismissal at 11:30 a.m. Please communicate with your child’s teacher if alternate transportation arrangements are required for this day.

Oct. 25<sup>th</sup> students will receive their weekly Fluoride Mouth Rinse. The program is a sage and very effective way to prevent tooth decay in children. Parental consent forms are required to participate in this free program.

Oct. 26<sup>th</sup> All aboard the train for students in Grade 4! Students will board the train on the NBM Railway at approximately 10:00 a.m. at Harbour Station and travel to Welsford and back. Students will be provided lunch consisting of two slices of cheese pizza, an apple, treat and water to drink. Students are asked to only bring water to drink and snacks if they wish.
