In the Simonds High School Memorial Grove, trees are planted in memory of a student, teacher, group, friend or family member or to celebrate a certain grad class. Our Memorial Grove has been growing; it is located outside the gym and continuing down the school driveway by the playing field. Alumni have donated the Princeton Golden Yellow maple trees. In the spring, three new trees were added to the grove. One was donated by the Class of 1968 (after their 50-yr reunion). The other two were in memory of Stephen Fillmore (1977) and James King (1979).

We invite individual alumni or classes who are planning future reunions to consider placing a memorial tree in the grove. What a beautiful way in which to remember a classmate/friend/family member! Simonds Breakfast Club

The Breakfast Club at Simonds is one of the initiatives which the Simonds Alumni and other groups assist in promoting and sponsoring. In its fourth school year, it serves approximately 50 students each day. In previous years grants have been obtained from Breakfast for Learning, but this year, the school was not a recipient of any grants. A kind and generous 1973 Simonds High grad makes donations of healthy muffins for the students. Generous donations of food and supplies from the Simonds retired teachers' group and two hot breakfasts/ year from the Simonds alumni also help. The breakfast room is supervised by teachers for 30 minutes before school each day. Some students enjoy a "grab and go" breakfast while others linger and chat over cereal. Breakfast options vary, but usually toast, bagels, cereal, yogurt, cheese, breakfast bars, fruit and healthy muffins are provided. Linda O'Blenis, a Simonds teacher and 1982 grad does a lot of the organizing and clean up from each breakfast.

The Breakfast Club is a very worthwhile program available to all students at Simonds. Students cannot learn if they are hungry. Unfortunately, this program is at risk of not continuing without the grant. An Exciting Opportunity for Simonds

Peter Woytiuk, a teacher in the Skilled Trades and Technology Department at Simonds has been pursuing Brilliant Labs for 3 years to assist with bringing a makerspace "lab" to the school. As the usable space became available, Brilliant Labs has committed to establishing this unique area at Simonds.

You may be wondering what exactly is makerspace. "To define a school makerspace by its purpose and simplest of terms, it is a place where young people have an opportunity to explore their own interests; learn to use tools and materials, both physical and virtual; and develop creative projects" Laura Flemming in Worlds of Making

At Simonds this space will be available for student use before and after school, at lunch and during class time for individual students or classes to work on school related projects. The course, Introduction to Applied Technology 110 (Maker) will be offered in the fall of 2020 and an Advanced Technology 120 (Maker) course will hopefully be offered in winter 2021. The makerspace at the school will be named; it is located in A205. To assist students to explore various areas of interest, there will be a variety of high tech tools such as computers for 2D animation and CNC (computer numerical control) machining as well as computer programming, robotics, rocketry, 3D modeling and printing and injection molding. There will also be some older tech tools such as sewing and embroidery machines and silk screening. Stations where students can construct models or do arts and crafts will be available also.

This is an amazing opportunity for the entire Simonds community! Sincere congratulations to Mr. Woytiuk for pursing this idea with Brilliant Labs and for bringing this equipment and these fascinating course options to the students!
