
# **News & Views**

## Simonds' Wetland Centre of Excellence Project

The Simonds Pond and Wetland Centre of Excellence project are progressing in an exciting way! FI Science and Math teacher, Michele Banks, is spearheading this project / partnership with Ducks Unlimited. A Wetland Centre of Excellence has been created in a classroom in the school. Team Green students decided to paint each of the four walls of the room to identify one of the four seasons. Don Fowler, an art teacher at the school, has students involved in painting portable murals for each of the seasons. Harold Stewart, construction teacher, is guiding classes in building duck nest boxes and songbird houses. Sandra Allain, FI teacher, and Michele Banks are diligently organizing the WCE room for present and future use. Soon, there will be a web page created by teacher, Jeff Scott, for the wetland centre.

Michele has been busy preparing Team Green members to assume a role of guiding local Elementary students through the wetland in the spring. Many guest speakers have come in to work with the students. Fundy Baykeeper and Marine Conservation Director Matt Abbott spoke to the students re conservation of the entire Bay of Fundy area. Ian Smith of Parks New Brunswick has been training the students on how to use "ice-breakers" to mentor and teach younger students. Katie Scott of Ducks Unlimited has taught the students some wetland games to use in their new role. Mme. Banks has been guiding her Team Green students (and grade 9 science classes) through activities including: tree identification, soil samples, core samples (to determine the age of trees), and critter dipping. This outdoor education and training of students is ongoing.

What is planned so far for 2016 for the Wetland Centre of Excellence Project? In December, the Calithumpians, a theatre group based out of Fredericton, will present an environmental drama to interested classes. Exciting plans are "in the works" on February 10 for World Wetland Day and for April, for Earth Day. In the spring the 527 Air Cadet Squadron will assist in the clean-up of the brook on school property. In addition, JD Irving will be doing some tree planting on site. Meanwhile, the Simonds Pond will continue to fill in naturally as the season's progress. This 5-year partnership with Ducks Unlimited Canada will continue to have many more exciting advancements and opportunities ahead. It will change the landscape of the back and side of the Simonds High School property and offer many new opportunities for residents of the community once trails through this wetland are built.
