## Influenza Vaccine for Children

This fall, the province of New Brunswick is offering free seasonal influenza vaccine to all children from 6 months to 18 years of age. Children under the age of 5 are at risk for more complications from influenza disease. Influenza disease spreads quickly among school-age children and they will pass it on to other family members and friends.

Stay Healthy! Make a flu shot appointment today with:

your family doctor, or another immunization provider such as:

VON (the Victorian Order of Nurses), for all children 6 months to 18 years of age (free vaccine) pregnant women (free vaccine) adults who are 65 years of age and older (free vaccine) all other age groups; a fee may apply Call 635-1530 to make an appointment for the nearest clinic in your area

Some pharmacists are offering flu shots, for anyone eligible who is 6 years of age and older Check with your local pharmacy.

Public Health, for children 6 months to 5 years of age

Call your local Public Health office for an appointment
